

Before Starting the Project Listings for the CoC Priority Listing

The CoC Consolidated Application requires TWO submissions. Both this Project Priority Listing AND the CoC Application MUST be completed and submitted prior to the submission deadline stated in the Unsheltered and Rural Homelessness Special NOFO.

The CoC Priority Listing includes:

- Unsheltered Homelessness Set Aside New Project Listing – lists all new project applications applying for funding through the Unsheltered Homelessness Set Aside that were approved and ranked or rejected by the CoC.
- Rural Set Aside Project Listing – lists all new project applications applying for funding through the Rural Set Aside that were approved and ranked or rejected by the CoC.
- UFA Costs Project Listing – applicable and only visible for Collaborative Applicants that were designated as a Unified Funding Agency (UFA) during the FY 2022 CoC Program Registration process. Only 1 UFA Costs project application is permitted and must be submitted by the Collaborative Applicant. The UFA project must be ranked amongst projects submitted on the Unsheltered Homelessness Set Aside New Project Listing.
- CoC Planning Project Listing – Only 1 CoC planning project is permitted per CoC and must be submitted by the Collaborative Applicant. The CoC Planning project must be ranked amongst projects submitted on the Unsheltered Homelessness Set Aside New Project Listing.
- HUD-2991, Certification of Consistency with the Consolidated Plan – Collaborative Applicants must attach an accurately completed, signed, and dated HUD-2991.

Things to Remember:

- All projects must be approved and ranked or rejected on the Project Listings. This includes funding for CoC Planning and UFA Costs, which must be ranked amongst projects submitted on the Unsheltered Homelessness Set Aside New Project Listing.
- Collaborative Applicants are responsible for ensuring all project applications accurately appear on the Project Listings and there are no project applications missing from one or more Project Listings.
- If a project application(s) is rejected by the CoC, the Collaborative Applicant must notify the project applicant(s) no later than 15 days before the CoC Program Competition application deadline outside of e-snaps and include the reason for rejection.
- For each project application rejected by the CoC the Collaborative Applicant must select the reason for the rejection from the dropdown provided.
- If the Collaborative Applicant needs to amend a project application for any reason after ranking has been completed, the ranking of other projects will not be affected; however, the Collaborative Applicant MUST ensure the amended project is returned to the applicable Project Listing AND re-rank the project application BEFORE submitting the CoC Priority Listing to HUD in e-snaps.

c) Briefly Describe the mission of the agency and funding sources used to support agency.

The mission of the North Carolina Coalition to End Homelessness (NCCEH) is to uphold human dignity by pursuing justice and engaging innovative partnerships to end homelessness in North Carolina. NCCEH works with communities to address root causes of homelessness by developing and implementing data-driven strategies that are focused on permanent housing and appropriate services. NCCEH's funding support comes from contracts with the NC DHHS, the Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation, Blue Cross and Blue Shield of North Carolina, HUD CoC funding, memberships, donations, and training registration fees.

Affordable Housing

1) What is your agency currently doing to promote affordable housing?

NCCEH coordinates the NC Balance of State Continuum of Care, which currently has 34 HUD grants to provide permanent supportive housing and rapid re-housing services to homeless individuals and families. NCCEH also supports the NC Housing Finance Agency and the NC Housing Coalition on programs to provide housing to homeless populations and promotes expanding affordable, permanent housing in all 12 Continuums of Care throughout North Carolina.

2) What is your agency applying for that requires a consistency to the consolidated plan for the State of North Carolina?

NCCEH is submitting an application to HUD on behalf of the NC Balance of State Continuum of Care. The application is for Continuum of Care funding that will provide rapid re-housing, permanent supportive housing, and supportive services to homeless people across the 79-county region, including families with children, people with disabilities, and chronically homeless people. NCCEH is also submitting project applications for CoC planning funds to increase capacity to effectively oversee the NC Balance of State CoC, for services funds to provide technical assistance for communities implementing their HUD-required coordinated assessment systems, and for HMIS funds to implement the HUD-required Homeless Management Information System across the CoC.

FAIR HOUSING

1) How does your agency promote fair housing and ensure fair housing law is implemented?

NCCEH advocates for fair housing principles in all areas of its work. NC Balance of State CoC grantees are required to affirmatively further fair housing through outreach to eligible program participants. NCCEH follows up on any fair housing complaint brought to its attention within the NC Balance of State CoC jurisdiction by contacting the claimant and referring him/her to the appropriate agency, including HUD and Legal Aid of North Carolina. In addition, NCCEH has worked closely with state partners on the Department of Justice Olmstead settlement to move people with disabilities from institutional settings to integrated community housing.

2) In the past fiscal year, how many fair housing complaints have been issued about the agency? Describe the type of fair housing complaint received.

No fair housing complaints have been issued against NCCEH.



c) Briefly Describe the mission of the agency and funding sources used to support agency.

In 2018, in the wake of Hurricane Florence, Governor Roy Cooper established the North Carolina Office of Recovery and Resiliency (NCORR) to lead the state's efforts in rebuilding smarter and stronger. NCORR manages nearly a billion dollars in U.S. Department of Housing and Urban

Development (HUD) funding in two grant types, Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds and Community Development Block Grant – Mitigation (CDBG-MIT), aimed at making North Carolina communities safer and more resilient from future storms. Additional funding is provided through the State Disaster Recovery Acts of 2017 and 2018, and the Storm Recovery Act of 2019.

Affordable Housing

1) What is your agency currently doing to promote affordable housing?

NCORR has established a Multi-Family Development Fund, Affordable Housing Development Fund, Public Housing Restoration Fund, and Homeownership Assistance Program to increase the availability of affordable housing in areas that were impacted by Hurricane Matthew and/or Hurricane Florence. These efforts provide more affordable living options to those still recovering from major storms and increases safety and resiliency for future storms. To date, the NCORR program has committed more than \$71.3 million in funding to projects that will create more than 1,000 affordable rental units, both in public housing and in private multi-family developments in storm-impacted regions of the state. Approximately \$53.5 million of the state’s HUD Community Development Block Grant–Disaster Recovery funds are being used in partnership with the N.C. Housing Finance Agency, public housing authorities in the cities of Lumberton and Wilson, and Cumberland County government to increase safe, affordable housing opportunities for low-to-moderate income households.

2) What is your agency applying for that requires a consistency to the consolidated plan for the State of North Carolina?

NCORR is applying to funds in partnership with the Balance of State Continuum of Care under a Special NOFO from HUD to address unsheltered and rural populations with severe service needs. This will require adherence to the Homelessness Strategy in the consolidated plan for the State of North Carolina. As outlined in the plan, close coordination will be needed with the Continuum of Care to address the needs of unsheltered populations, rural populations, and populations with severe service needs. All planned activities as part of this grant will be consistent with the consolidated plan and the needs, strategies, and priorities outlined therein.

FAIR HOUSING

1) How does your agency promote fair housing and ensure fair housing law is implemented?

NCORR adheres to all federal, state, and local laws pertaining to Fair Housing including the Fair Housing Act (FHA), Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 as amended (ADA), and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Section 504). NCORR has a designated Coordinator that oversees, manages, and reports on NCORR’s activities related to fair housing, equal opportunity, and reasonable accommodation and reasonable modification requests.

No formal fair housing complaints have been issued about NCORR in the past fiscal year.
