# Working with Clients with Psychotic Disorders

# Psychosis

- Schizophrenia Spectrum Disorders
  - 3.48% lifetime prevalence of mental illness with psychosis
  - 5-17% general population have ever had psychotic symptoms
- Can also be caused by:
  - Mood disorders
  - Substance use or withdrawal
  - Delirium/medical illness



# Symptoms of Psychosis

- **Hallucinations**
  - Abnormal perceptions in any of the senses
- **Delusions**
  - Strongly held beliefs
- **Disorganization**
  - Thought process and/or behavior
- “Negative” Symptoms
  - Difficulty thinking, doing, or emoting
  - Limited speech
  - Limited thought content
  - Apathy
  - Withdrawal
  - **Catatonia**





# Treatment

- Can look like:
  - Medication
  - Therapy
  - Supportive employment/housing
  - Skills training
- It can be effective
  - Recovery at 10 years follow up is 44%
  - 35% of those recovered but not working
  - Longer duration with untreated psychosis and/or unemployment predicts more difficult recovery





# Challenge for SOAR Workers

# Challenges

- Typically SOAR clients are less stable by definition
  - Functional impairment is enough to prevent significant work
- Difficult to keep clients engaged
- Psychosis can disrupt rapport/trust
- Though most clients who have psychosis are never violent
  - We want to be aware of boundaries/safety



# Advocate Mindset

- Trauma-Informed Care
  - High rates of trauma and victimization
  - Social stigma and rejection
- Empathy
  - How difficult would it be to concentrate if voices would not leave you alone?
  - How difficult would it be to trust if you regularly faced fear and disgust from strangers?





# Practical Suggestions- Your Ideas

- Developing contact network (friends/family/providers/collateral sources) in first few meetings
- Meet for first time with trusted person or in trusted place
- Bring coffee/food/socks or other offerings for comfort
- Being sensitive to paranoia around technology/leaving room/talking with coworkers
- Options for involuntary treatment?



# Practical Suggestions

- Meeting in familiar, trusted setting
- Meeting with trusted person
- Going at client's pace
- Being aware of warning signs of escalation
- Connect to supportive resources
  - VR
  - Injectable antipsychotics
- Seek supervision/consultation
- Seek training



# Reality

- We may not be able to engage everyone
- We may need support from other providers
- We may need more training/experience
- We may need to wait for clients to be more stable
