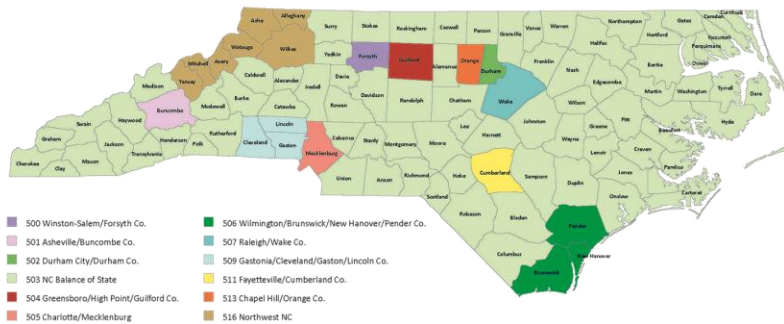

## What is Balance of State?

- One of 12 CoCs in NC



## Continuum of Care

- Regional or local planning body that coordinates housing and services funding for homeless families and individuals
- Wide range of agencies and organizations represented
- Promotes communitywide commitment to ending homelessness
- Required for applying for HUD homeless funding
  - CoC
  - ESG

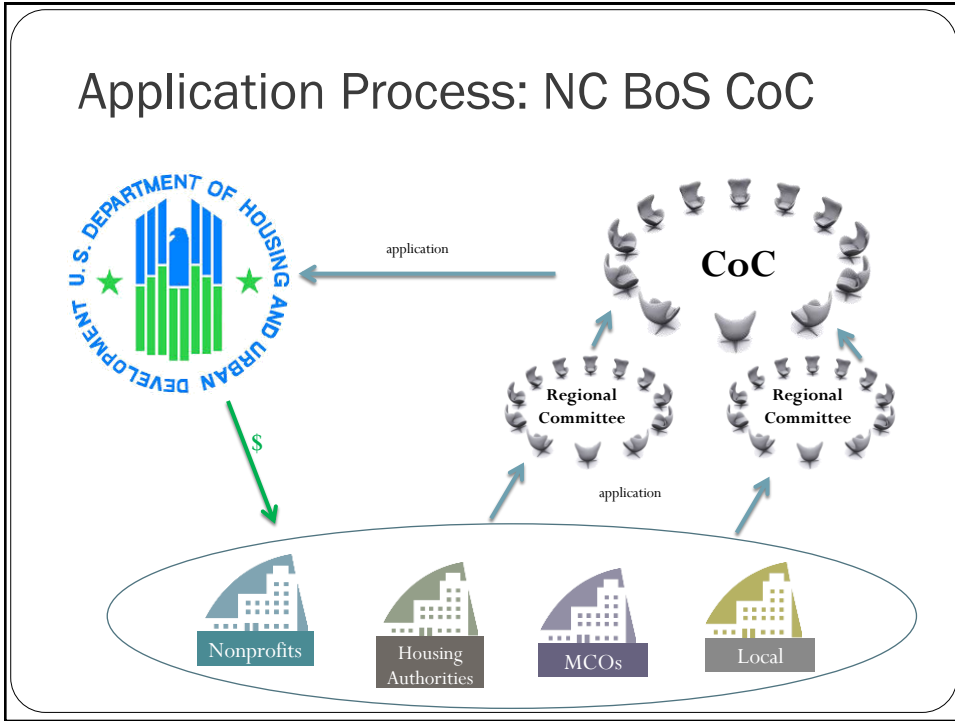


## CoC Roles & Responsibilities

- Operating a CoC
  - Governance
  - System operations
  - CoC Components: Coordinated Intake, Written Standards, Performance Expectations & Monitoring
- Designating HMIS
  - Data collection integral to HEARTH
  - CHIN in North Carolina
- Planning for CoC Future

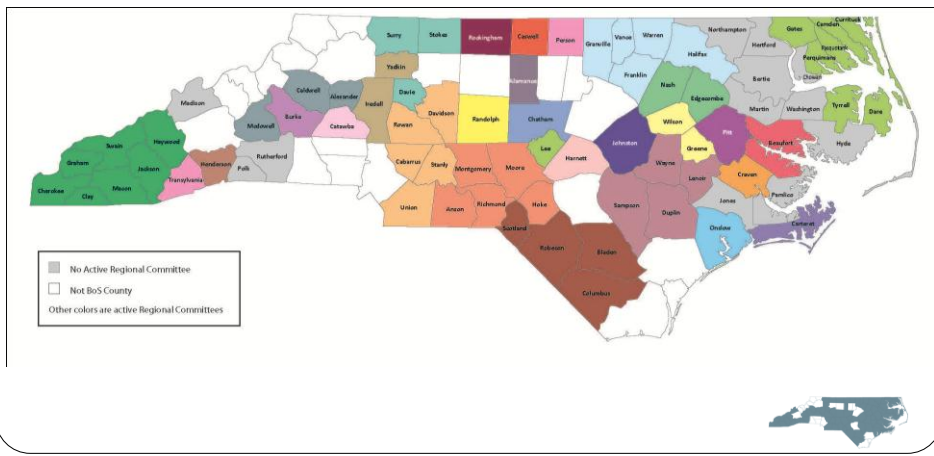


## Application Process: NC BoS CoC



## Balance of State

- Organized into 30 Regional Committees



## NC BoS: Committee Structure

- Steering Committee
- 30 Regional Committees
- Subcommittees
  - Permanent Supportive Housing
  - Rapid Re-Housing
  - Data Quality
- Funding Committees
  - Scorecard Committee
  - Project Review Committee



## Role of Project Review Committee

- Comprised of one representative from each Regional Committee
  - Members cannot be from agencies applying for funding
- Scores project applications using current Scorecard
- Recommends ranked list of project applications for CoC collaborative application to the Steering Committee



## Scoring & Ranking: Why?

- Performance-based measurement
  - Congruent with HEARTH spirit
    - Accountability & transparency
    - Data-driven
  - 5 Scorecard goals
    1. Fund organizations with capacity
    2. Fund projects that reflect NC BoS & HUD priorities
    3. Incentivize agencies to be good partners
    4. Strengthen Regional Committee performance
    5. Funded projects good stewards of funding



## 2014 Funding Context

- 42 renewal projects from 23 applicants
- Total Annual Renewal Demand (ARD) = \$ 5,696,021
  - Tier One = \$ 5,582,100
  - Tier Two = \$ 113,921



## Scoring: How?

- Renewal grants only this year, per HUD
  - 42 grants from 23 grantees
  - Grantees submitted project apps by Oct 3
  - Each grant scored by
    - One member of Project Review Committee
    - One staff member of NCCEH
  - Scores are averaged
  - Added to Staff Only scores for objective measures
  - Final project score



## Scorecard Review

- 4 pages of 10 page scorecard



## Ranking: How?

- Meeting on Fri Oct 17
  - Register on NCCEH website if you have not already
- List of projects ranked by score
- Specific project considerations
  - Minimum & threshold concerns
  - Late applications
  - Revised APR
- Committee discusses and finalizes funding options and proposed list
- Steering Committee votes on final ranked list Mon Oct 20
  - Members with a conflict of interest not eligible to vote
